





- ### Regional Communications
- Pre-Budget Announcement occurred 5 and 20 May 2010.
  - 10 Regional hui held April / May provided greater detail on the implementation of the Whānau Ora approach.
  - Allowed for engagement with sector bodies and iwi.
  - Whānau Ora Governance Group opened 10 June EOI and RLG apps
  - Full information packs available through MSD, MoH and TPK websites
  - Regional Leadership Groups assess and recommend to Governance
  - Whānau Ora Governance Group make final decisions.

- ### EOI Process
- The EOI document will invite eligible providers - either as stand-alone providers or provider collectives - to describe how they would achieve results that contribute to improved outcomes for whānau. This would include identifying:
    - the strengths, contributions and resources they bring, and can mobilise for the well-being of whānau, including their existing contracts;
    - whānau issues and needs within their communities;
    - proposals to meet identified issues and needs, through utilising their existing contracts and services, brokering whānau engagement with relevant services; and other activities that may be required to build whānau capability;
    - who they would work with to achieve this change; and
    - the resources and development they need to achieve this change.

- ### Programmes of Action
- Provider Programmes of Action will be developed that detail the specific actions the provider will undertake to:
    - address identified barriers and needs;
    - establish a process for the integration of contracts;
    - identify development needs, costs, outputs and timeframes.
  - The Governance Group will oversee the process and provide advice on agency decision-making.
  - Regions will need to provide advice on various organisations.
  - More importantly there will need to be a very close cooperation between agencies in the development of these programmes, alongside relevant providers.

- ### Scaled Localised Packages of Support
- Whānau Ora Training, Service and Organisational Transformation:*
- Examples of how funding might be expended include:
    - Whānau Ora Practitioner training – Training staff to adopt more whānau centred approaches, training whānau champions or navigators to engage with and support whānau engagement with services
    - Service integration – Complement work to integrate contracts. Include improving business systems, developing user friendly pathways of care for whānau
    - Infrastructure - to meet practical infrastructure needs such as improving information technology and reporting systems (probably building off existing IT systems such as Medtech in health).

## Scaled Localised Packages of Support

### Whānau Integration, Innovation and Engagement

- Invest in a range of activities that build whānau capability, strengthen whānau connections, support the development of whānau leadership and enhance best outcomes for whānau.
- Proposals will focus on the development of:
  - whānau plans, toolkits and other resources that are consistent with the Whānau Ora approach;
  - specific whānau leadership development and training programmes;
  - mentoring programmes for whānau;
  - initiatives to support the inter-generational transfer of knowledge, values and attitudes within and across whānau;
  - initiatives to promote healthy lifestyles across whānau;
  - initiatives to promote education and employment opportunities for whānau; and
  - initiatives to support whānau to have warm and healthy homes.

## Scaled Localised Packages of Support

### Whānau Integration, Innovation and Engagement

- Proposals will be assessed by Te Puni Kōkiri on the extent to which they meet identified criteria.
- Proposals that meet the criteria will then be referred to Regional Leadership Groups for further assessment and recommendation back to Te Puni Kōkiri of preferred proposals.
- Te Puni Kōkiri will undertake due diligence of recommended proposals (in consultation with other agencies as required) and action those who meet all requirements.
- Te Puni Kōkiri will have responsibility for monitoring the contracts and the risks associated with these contracts.
- Cabinet yet to approve final settings to this funding and will not until July 2010.

## Research, Evaluation and Monitoring

Three distinct, but complementary levels of activity focussing:

- at the **whānau** level, action research with a wide range of whānau to gauge the success of the design, implementation and impact of the approach;
- at the **provider** level:
  - action research with providers will be used to refine the systems, processes and programmes that are delivered in supporting whānau to achieve their goals;
  - formal programme evaluation will consider the success of the broader approach, in terms of design, implementation and impact;
- at the **government** level, outcomes monitoring with the development of a range of indicators to inform the continuous improvement in the quality of Whānau Ora service delivery.
